

This is a feeder course for the Isle of Man Manufacturing Companies, Aircraft Maintenance and Marine Engineering companies and has been developed in partnership between the Engineering Sector Skills Group, Department of Economic Development and University College Isle of Man.

## What are the entry requirements?

Entry onto the course depends on your results of the aptitude test and your GCSE grades

## What is the course about?

### YEAR 1

Practical Training – developing skills in fitting, conventional Milling, Turning and CNC machining at the Advanced Manufacturing Training Centre at Hills Meadow, Peel Road, Douglas.

Academic studies - either a Craft Level 1, Level 2 or Level 3 Technical Certificate at UCM as academic studies. (This will depend on your GCSE and aptitude test results).

Industry liaison – half a day spent in industry – looking at a range of engineering operations and including a summer placement in industry.

### YEAR 2

A choice of pathways may be available depending upon employer and student demand. Those interested in manufacturing will examine more in depth CNC Milling and Turning including multi axis machining. Aircraft and marine maintenance options will also be available. Isle of Man Engineering companies will be recruiting successful candidates from this course, although IT IS NOT A GUARANTEE OF A JOB.
