### What is the course about?

A course designed to introduce the basics of working with traditional photographic techniques in a darkroom.

An opportunity to learn about traditional darkroom techniques. Many photographers are moving away from modern digital photography and are finding greater satisfaction in returning to traditional technique. This course will offer the opportunity to learn these older processes and find out whether you agree.

Getting back to basics working in safe lighting, handling of light sensitive materials, film processing, enlarging and printing, along with some other fun darkroom activities such as photogrammes and chemical painting.

During the course, students will have access to the College's Art and Design Department's photographic studio and darkroom.

### Assessment:

The group will share the outcomes of all work undertaken and will learn from each other's successes and failures within a supportive and encouraging environment.

### Previous experience:

No previous experience is necessary. A basic understanding of camera photography would be helpful but not essential.

### Equipment you need to bring:

If at all possible, beg, borrow (but don't steal) a 35mm film camera. There may be a few film cameras which could be borrowed if necessary.

### General Information:

The times advertised for courses, especially 1-day and short courses, will normally include break(s) and a lunch period, as appropriate, and by agreement with the tutor at the sessions.

Students attending one-day workshops might like to note that there are hot/cold drinks and snack vending machines (crisps, sweets, chocolate, biscuits etc) in the College Refectory, which will

be open during the day, but there are no sandwiches etc available, so students might like to bring a packed lunch with them, which can be consumed in the Refectory.
