What is the course about?

This is a St John Ambulance certificated course.

The course deals with serious conditions and incidents, it covers emergency life support procedures for adults. It is ideal if you want to know what to do when faced with an emergency.

The course is for members of the public who want to know what action to take in any emergency and want to learn how to deal with accidents and injuries.

St John Ambulance welcomes young people from the age of 12 onto all of their community first aid courses. If under the age of 16, you must attend with a responsible adult member of the family or guardian (two young people per adult)

You will learn about –

- Communication and casualty care
- Looking after yourself and the casualty
- Adult resuscitation
- Treatment of severe bleeding and chest pain
- Treatment of choking in adults
- Treatment of an unconscious casualty

Previous experience:

No previous experience required, all welcome.

Assessment and certification:

Continuous assessment by the trainer.

General Information:

The times advertised for courses, especially 1-day and short courses, will normally include break(s) and a lunch period, as appropriate, and by agreement with the tutor at the sessions.
