
City & Guilds 2850 Level 2 Certificate in Engineering

What is the course about?

This Level 2 Certificate is aimed at engineering apprentices from local industry and is designed to provide them with a practical understanding of a broad range of engineering activities. The course is a one year course which will require attendance at the William Kennish Building one day per week, this is normally 9.00am to 5.00pm.

What are the entry requirements?

Candidates who are school leavers should ideally have a Grade D in Maths, a Science and English. Mature candidates will be interviewed and their experience will be assessed.

All candidates will be given an initial assessment test.

What subjects will I study?

There two mandatory units and one specialist unit which all candidates will study. These units are mainly theory units which support the practical topics.

Two mandatory units:

- Working in Engineering
- Principles of Engineering Technology

One specialist unit:

- Principles of Manufacturing Technology

Two practical units need to be achieved these can be selected from Bench Fitting, Milling and Turning. The two machining units are based on manual machining.

How will I be assessed?

The mandatory and specialist units are assessed by on-line multi-choice exams or short written test. The practical units are assessed by a practical assignment and a short written test

What are my progression and career paths?

Successful completion of the elements progression can be to City & Guilds 2850 Level 3.
