

International applicants must satisfy both the English language entry requirement **and** the academic entry requirement for their chosen course in order to be eligible to study.

English language entry requirements

Applicants whose first language is not English must demonstrate that they have an appropriate level of English language to be eligible to study one of our undergraduate or postgraduate courses. The level of English required depends on the course applied for.

Academic entry requirements

Applicants must satisfy the academic entry criteria for their chosen course of study in order to be eligible to study.

Undergraduate/Bachelor's degree

For entry onto the first year of our undergraduate/bachelor degree courses, we normally require a school leaving qualification which is equivalent to British A-level/International Baccalaureate.

Postgraduate Taught/Master's degree

Entry onto our postgraduate Masters' courses requires an undergraduate/bachelor degree of equivalent standard to the British undergraduate/bachelor degree.
